THE DIRECTOR OF MISSIONS


With the school year starting we have two initiatives that are being finalized and soon to become a reality. I'm excited that we are close to officially launching these in the coming weeks - just as the students and teachers head back to the classroom. Each of these are driven by our mission statement: **Strengthening our churches to engage our communities with the gospel**.

- 1) Students In Transition (SIT) | With the start of the school year starting this month we are eager to get our SIT Closets up and running. We are still collecting new and gently used clothing (new socks and underwear) for children of all ages and toiletry items (toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs, deodorant, soap, shampoo, etc.) These will be housed at association churches closest to each of the county's 20 schools. When a child is in need, school personnel refer them to the closest "Students In Transition" closet. The closets will be stocked through the collective efforts of all of our churches. Final details are being worked out and we hope to open them in the coming weeks.
- **2)** PrayerZones is Coming! | We are close to officially launching this important challenge to our area churches to strategically be praying for our areas schools, their students and staff. The video is done, the Prayer Guides have been designed, and technical hurdles are being dealt with on the website. Look for some exciting news on the this very, very soon!

Summertime means camps, and through Impact VA, the PBA has been afforded the opportunity to be involved in this great summertime activity. During the week of July 10th, Impact VA along with the PBA (provided daily lunches and Gatorade) and Averett University (provided housing and meals), afforded around eighty middle/high school aged kids the opportunity to be involved in serving God through construction projects.

This year we tackled six projects in Danville and Pittsylvania County. These projects consisted of providing needed wheelchair ramps, installing a new roof, remodeling the interior of a house for wheelchair accessibility, and a fresh coat of paint for the House of Hope (Danville's homeless shelter). The relationships between the kids and homeowners produced an atmosphere of love and compassion that created smiling faces and tears of joy. It reassured the homeowners that God does care for those who are in need, giving all involved a better understanding of what it truly means to walk in Christlikeness.

Although construction projects are the center of Impact camps, it is so much more. Impact is rooted in the Great Commission, offering the kids morning and nightly worship events, daily Bible studies, along with Christian mentorship. Impact may only be a week-long camp, but its effect has a lasting impact (for some eternal) on the lives of all who

were involved.




